



HOW TO GROW THE BEST VINCAS

Vincas are very tough, resilient flowers that thrive in hot summer weather.

Vincas have dark green foliage that smothers out weeds and produce non-stop flowers that shed cleanly so they never need trimming.

To prevent possible diseases, do not plant in the same spot year after year. Also avoid planting until the weather is dependably warm in spring and at least two weeks after the last frost.

When properly fertilized, vincas will bloom continuously from the time they are planted until the frost hits the following season.

When planting vincas in beds, cultivate the planting site at least 20cm deep and mix in a 5 cm deep layer of planting mix, compost or other organic matter.

Vinca bloom prolifically in summer heat, and you may not need to fertilise plants more than once after initial planting, however if growth slows or you notice older leaves turning yellow that you should fertilise lightly.
